The Peja Culture Pavilion competition invites architects and designers to reimagine a historically significant site in the heart of Peja, Kosovo. This competition seeks innovative proposals that integrate the 15th-century water fountain into a multifunctional public pavilion, revitalizing the area as a vibrant cultural and social hub. Participants are encouraged to combine contemporary design with historical preservation, creating a space that honors Peja's rich heritage while serving the community's modern needs.





Kosovo, located in the Balkan Peninsula of Southeast Europe, is a region rich in history and cultural diversity. Having declared its independence from Serbia in 2008, Kosovo is one of the newest countries in the world. Despite its young age as an independent state, Kosovo has a long and complex history, with influences from various civilizations including the Romans, Byzantines, and Ottomans. This diverse heritage is reflected in its architecture, traditions, and cultural practices. Peja

Peja is home to numerous historical landmarks, including the Patriarchate of Peć, a medieval Serbian Orthodox monastery that is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This site, along with others in the region, underscores Peja's historical significance and its role as a cultural crossroads in the Balkans. In addition to its historical sites, Peja is known for its vibrant community life and scenic landscapes. The city serves as a gateway to the Rugova Canyon, a popular destination for hiking, climbing, and outdoor recreation. The combination of cultural depth and natural beauty makes Peja a unique and attractive destination. Over the years, Peja has been focusing on revitalizing its urban spaces to enhance the quality of life for its residents and to attract visitors. The city's commitment to preserving its heritage while embracing modern development is evident in its various initiatives aimed at promoting cultural and economic growth.





The competition peja culture pavilion

The city center of Peja, Kosovo, hosts a historically significant site that has long been a focal point for community gatherings and social interactions. Rich in cultural and recreational elements, this central location, originally designed for leisure and relaxation, has been an integral part of the urban landscape. One of its most notable features is an ancient water source dating back to the 15th century, which remains under the protection of the Ministry of Culture of Kosovo. Despite its historical and cultural importance, the site has been neglected for years, falling into disrepair and disuse. This Peja Water Fountain Pavilion competition, aims to revitalize this area, transforming it into a vibrant public hotspot. The competition is spearheaded by Collective Action for Culture (C.A.C), with the support of the Municipality of Peja, the Ministry of Culture, and the Office of the President of Kosovo. Collective Action for Culture is known for organizing Rrugë Fest, a cultural initiative that rejuvenates urban spaces through artistic expression and community involvement. With the support from these partners, the organization aims to empower artists, engage residents, and transform neglected areas into lively cultural destinations. The focal point of the Peja Culture Pavilion competition is the ancient 15th-century water fountain, a historically significant artifact reflecting Peja's long and storied past. This water fountain, preserved over centuries, serves as a vital cultural and historical landmark. Participants are encouraged to propose new designs that integrate and celebrate this water fountain, making it a central and vital part of their overall design proposals. The competition seeks innovative ideas to transform the site into a lively participatory public area. The primary objective is to design a flexible multipurpose pavilion and an engaging outdoor space that revitalizes the area. The pavilion should serve as a cultural center that not only integrates the 15th-century water fountain but also enhances its historical importance. The pavilion should provide a versatile environment for social events, art activities, and community gatherings. Additionally, the outdoor space should be designed to become a vibrant public hotspot, fostering social interactions and cultural engagement. Design proposals should balance contemporary architectural advancements with historical conservation, emphasizing the water fountain's historical significance. Proposals should utilize environment-friendly materials and sustainable construction methods, ensuring the site honors its past while embracing modern needs.

Through this competition, the organizers aim to breathe new life into this historically rich site, making it a central point of community activity and cultural pride once again. The revitalized area will honor its historical roots, particularly the ancient water fountain, while paving the way for a vibrant and sustainable future.

Competition programme

The Peja Culture Pavilion competition seeks innovative design proposals that integrate the historical 15th-century water fountain into a multifunctional public space. The aim is to create a versatile and engaging environment that revitalizes the area and serves as a vibrant cultural hotspot. The design should be both aesthetically pleasing and functional, catering to various community needs and activities.

Central pavilion space

Purpose:

Serve as the main area for cultural events, exhibitions, and community gatherings.

Approximate size:

50-70 square meters.

Features:

Flexible open floor plan, high ceilings, natural lighting, integrated seating, and multimedia capabilities (e.g., sound and projection systems).

This multifunctional indoor area should be adaptable for various uses, such as art exhibitions, cultural performances, and community meetings. The design should allow for easy reconfiguration of the space to accommodate different events, ensuring flexibility and utility.

👮 Outdoor amphitheater

Purpose:

Provide a space for performances, presentations, and public speaking events.

Features:

Tiered seating, stage area, and acoustic design considerations.

An amphitheater with tiered seating will provide an outdoor venue for live performances, lectures, and community events. It should be designed with acoustics in mind to ensure sound quality and equipped with basic stage facilities.

\square Historical fountain integration

Purpose:

Highlight and preserve the 15th-century water fountain as a central feature.

Features:

Protective structures, enhanced visibility, interpretive signage, and seating around the fountain.

The ancient water fountain should be prominently featured and integrated into the overall design. This area should be both a place of contemplation and a focal point that draws visitors. Protective measures should ensure its preservation while making it accessible and appreciated by the public.

Purpose:

Offer relaxation areas and enhance the aesthetic appeal of the site.

Features:

Native plants, walking paths, benches, and shaded areas.

These areas should offer natural beauty and tranquility, enhancing the site's appeal and providing a relaxing environment. The design should incorporate local flora and create inviting pathways and seating areas.

Purpose:

Display public art, sculptures, and installations.

Features:

Pedestals, lighting for nighttime viewing, and interactive elements.

Dedicated spaces for art installations will add a dynamic and creative element to the site. These should be strategically placed to complement the overall design and encourage interaction from visitors.



Pathways and accessibility

Purpose:

Ensure easy and inclusive access throughout the site.

Features:

Paved walkways, ramps, signage, and lighting.

Well-designed pathways will ensure that all areas of the site are easily accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities. Clear signage and lighting will enhance navigation and safety. The COMPETITION PROGRAMME is flexible, open for modifications and improved development strategies.

The competition site

Situated in the heart of Peja, Kosovo, the competition site is a historically significant area centrally located in the city. This prime location, which has been a focal point for community gatherings and social interactions for centuries, is home to the ancient 15th-century water fountain, an architectural gem protected by the Ministry of Culture of Kosovo.




Site restrictions



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Project budget requirements

The total budget for the Peja Culture Pavilion project is estimated to be around €50,000. Participants are encouraged to prioritize cost-effectiveness and rationalize expenses in their designs. Proposals should demonstrate a thoughtful approach to financial feasibility, focusing on innovative yet practical solutions that maintain low costs while achieving the architectural objectives outlined in the competition brief.

The budget breakdown is as follows:

- Materials: €25,000
- Labor: €15,000
- Miscellaneous Costs: €10,000

These budget guidelines are general, and participants should treat them as an approximate guideline. No detailed cost analysis is required. Participants should strive to use environmentfriendly materials and sustainable construction methods to ensure the project's longevity and minimal environmental impact. The goal is to create a functional, inviting, and iconic addition to Peja's urban landscape, honoring the historical significance of the ancient water fountain while providing a contemporary and engaging environment for community and cultural activities.

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

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



Submission requirements

Project submission

 Participants are required to upload four (4) A2 landscape-orientated presentation boards (must not exceed 10MB per board) with sketches, renderings, plans, sections, elevations, diagrams, and/or other presentation tools to explain their proposal.



- No video files are accepted.
- All information provided in writing must be in English.
- All submissions must be uploaded via the architecturecompetitions.com upload panel. Access information and instructions on how to upload the presentation board will be issued to participants via email immediately after successful registration.
- Presentation boards must not indicate any information related to individual's/team's identity.

Participants who do not comply with the requirements will be disqualified without refund.

Your project in the media

Participants are required to submit a cover image and a project description in the project upload panel. These will be used for publication purposes and will not be seen by the jury. The image and text need to be submitted in the project upload panel at the time of project upload.

Cover image

Participants can choose and upload **one project preview image from their presentation** that best describes their project.

- The project preview image would need to be at least 2000x1680 pixels large, orientated horizontally, no more than 10 MB in size, and in jpg/jpeg format.
- The project preview image will be used for promotional materials to showcase the project in case the project is selected as the winner.

• Please note: the competition jury will not see the selected project preview image.

Project description

In the project upload panel, participants will be asked to add their project description. Please note that this will not be seen by the jury but will be used mainly for publication purposes. In the project description, please

include the following:

Project Overview:

Provide a brief summary of the project.

Assignment:

Explain the task or problem you were assigned to solve.

• Objectives:

Outline the main goals and objectives of the project.

Design Concept:

Describe the design concept and the inspiration behind it.

• Approach and Strategy:

Detail the approach and strategy you used to tackle the project.

• Key Features:

Highlight the key features and unique aspects of the design.

• Materials and Techniques:

Mention the materials and techniques used in the project.

Challenges:

Discuss any challenges you faced and how you overcame them.

Results:

Share the outcomes and results of the project.

Recommended submission contet

Landscape visualization:

A visualization that illustrates how the proposed pavilion complements the historical surroundings of the Peja site and enhances the visitor experience, integrating the ancient water fountain as a central feature.

Concept designs:

Designs that emphasize the highest quality standards, aligning with the design brief and the unique characteristics of the project site, while highlighting the historical and cultural significance of the water fountain.

Visualizations:

Artist's impressions from various vantage points to illustrate how the proposal integrates with the historical and cultural value of the site, showcasing the potential to become a vibrant community and cultural hotspot.

Detailed plans and sections:

Submissions should include key points of proposed plans and sections, as well as multiple internal and external perspectives demonstrating the spatial quality of the pavilion, along with its operational needs and accessibility requirements.

Project feasibility demonstration:

A detailed analysis concerning the environmental impact, adaptability to climate conditions, life cycle, and the use of materials characterized by low environmental impact and high durability.

Comprehensive design presentation:

Proposed plans, sections, and multiple internal and external perspectives that showcase the spatial quality of the pavilion and landscape elements. These should also detail operational needs and demonstrate compliance with accessibility standards.

Construction and sustainability strategies:

A thorough presentation on project construction, material selection, functional aspects, management, and maintenance plans. This should also include an approach to environmental sustainability, energy efficiency, and logistics.

Presentation deliverables set

- Urban plan (suggested scale 1:500 or 1:1000)
- Street elevations (suggested scale 1:50)
- Primary sections (suggested scale 1:50)
- Primary floor plans (suggested scale 1:50)
- Enlarged sections and elevations highlighting key spaces or relationships (suggested scale 1:10)
- Details (suggested scale 1:5):
 - Envelope
 - Key materials
 - Site or landscape
- Axonometrics providing information on building systems or illustrating key architectural concepts
- Perspectives
 - Primary interior spaces
 - Primary site locations

- Diagrams
 - Circulation
 - Public versus private space
 - Lighting
 - Landscaping
 - Transportation
 - Energy systems
 - Cityscapes/urban relationships

Please note the PRESENTATION DELIVERABLES SET listed above is a suggestion only. Participants can choose to use the entire list, a selection from it, or propose a completely different set that would explain their design in the most efficient manner.
